



Report on "Collection and Donation Drive"

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of MNIT Jaipur successfully organized a comprehensive Collection and Donation Drive. This sustained initiative was designed to promote the spirit of service, responsible resource management, and social contribution within the institute community.

The drive focused on gathering essential items and reusable goods to benefit local underprivileged communities. The overarching goal was to reinforce civic responsibility and promote a culture of environmental mindfulness and active charity through a focused, continuous effort, thereby translating the commitment to service into a meaningful societal impact.

Objectives

- To foster civic responsibility through active community service.
- To promote sustainability by conserving and redistributing reusable resources.
- To provide material support to local underprivileged communities.
- To encourage youth participation in sustained social outreach.
- To minimize waste by extending the lifespan of usable items.

Event Details

- Phase I: Collection (October 17 October 31): The drive commenced on October 17 and concluded on October 31, encouraging the campus community to contribute essential items and reusable goods over a sustained fifteen-day period.
- Phase II: Segregation (November 5 & November 9): Following the collection, the donated material underwent a meticulous sorting process on November 5 and November 9. Items were carefully segregated based on critical parameters, including wearable sizes, intended use, age group, and the specific necessities of the different age categories, ensuring the aid was optimally prepared for distribution.
- Phase III: Distribution (November 16): The culmination of the effort took place on November 16, when the segregated materials were directly distributed to the underprivileged populations. The target beneficiaries were the needy individuals residing in vulnerable locations near Amrudo ka Bagh, City Park & SFS Circle, effectively translating the spirit of service into direct, meaningful social impact.

Volunteer and Community Engagement

The Collection and Donation Drive witnessed enthusiastic involvement from 20 dedicated student participants and NSS volunteers. The core NSS team members efficiently managed the comprehensive event logistics, which included setting up collection points, coordinating outreach, and meticulous execution of the segregation process on November 5 and 9. Their consistent commitment and diligence in sorting and preparing the materials, followed by the direct distribution on November 16, strongly reflected the foundational principle of "Not Me, But You", which is the cornerstone of the NSS philosophy. Their collaborative effort ensured the timely and impactful success of this social outreach initiative.

- Instilled a strong sense of civic duty and empathy among student volunteers.
- Promoted sustainable practices through the efficient conservation and redistribution of usable goods.
