



Report on "Shiksha Saarthi"

The **National Service Scheme** (NSS), unit of MNIT Jaipur, successfully sustained its core initiative, **Shiksha Saarthi**, dedicated to providing specialized educational support to pre-primary school students from local underprivileged communities. This continuous effort is strategically designed to address the foundational knowledge gap and the lack of interactive, **"friendly education"** often required for these students to keep pace with contemporary societal trends and educational standards.

The initiative involves regular, structured teaching sessions across various subjects. The overarching goal is twofold: to translate the institute's commitment to **civic responsibility** into **meaningful societal impact** by empowering young learners, and simultaneously to cultivate the essential professional and personal skills of our student volunteers.

Objectives

- To promote sustained community engagement and civic responsibility through educational mentorship.
- To provide volunteers with practical teaching experience, focusing on curriculum adaptation and effective doubt resolution.
- To cultivate volunteers' ability to clearly communicate complex concepts and manage a classroom setting.
- To equip young learners with the robust, core knowledge necessary for successful progression in the formal education system.
- To establish a continuous service model that delivers measurable, positive societal outcomes through focused education.

Event Details

November 8th

The Shiksha Saarthi initiative hosted its first educational mentorship session on 8 November.
 Aligned with objectives such as promoting community engagement and equipping young learners with core knowledge, the event saw high participation.

- The setting was a government school in Jaipur (max capacity 150 students). Approximately **120-130 students** were actively engaged throughout the day.
- A dedicated team of an estimated 16 volunteers participated, working across morning and
 afternoon shifts. This volunteer strength ensured a highly effective teacher-student ratio of
 roughly 1:8, facilitating personalized attention and effective doubt resolution.
- Volunteers covered essential subjects for the students' academic progression: English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Social Science, Computer Science, Mathematics

November 15th

- The second impactful session of the Shiksha Saarthi program took place on 15 November, continuing the mission of providing practical teaching experience to volunteers and delivering positive societal outcomes through focused education.
- Held at the same government school in Jaipur, the event maintained strong student engagement, with approximately **120-130 students** in attendance.
- An estimated **14 volunteers** contributed their time across morning and afternoon shifts. This number complemented the first session, bringing the total volunteer count for the initiative to maximum 30. The ratio remained excellent, ensuring volunteers could effectively communicate complex concepts and manage the classroom setting efficiently.
- The curriculum focus remained consistent, addressing core academic areas:
 - English
 - o Hindi
 - Sanskrit
 - Social Science
 - Computer Science
 - Mathematics

Outcomes

- Positive relationships were established between the student body and the Jaipur school community.
- An effective service model was implemented, delivering tangible educational benefits to approximately 120-130 students across two days.
- The event effectively showcased the club's mission through practical, hands-on mentorship and educational support.
- Volunteers gained valuable hands-on classroom experience, enhancing their ability to communicate complex concepts and manage group environments.
- The initiative successfully showcased the college club's commitment to sustained community engagement.
